

General Notes

- The purpose of this graph is unclear, and not as informative as it could be.
- I clicked on an individual student's name, yet the graph is titled "scores by standard." Does this mean there were multiple questions for the one standard?
- If the graph is just showing 100% for correct and 0% for incorrect, there could be a better way of displaying this information, for example a table.
- The Y-Axis needs to be labeled with more specific numbers. Since it would be difficult to number the Y-Axis with numbers 1-100, if you scrolled over the bar and it should tell you the exact number associated with that bar/standard.
- The X-Axis needs to be labeled with both the standard and the question number.
- When you scroll over the bar, a class average pops up. This is very helpful, and could also be done with a line on the graph showing the class average.

standard number, there needs to be a dropdown/or scroll over that has the actual standard written in it's entirely or at least an abbreviated mention of what the standard is (could be done in either place). Would not have to be both.




There needs to be **sorting options** with this report, much like the student scores report. It would be able to sort the questions by standard, percent correct, and percent incorrect.




General Notes
